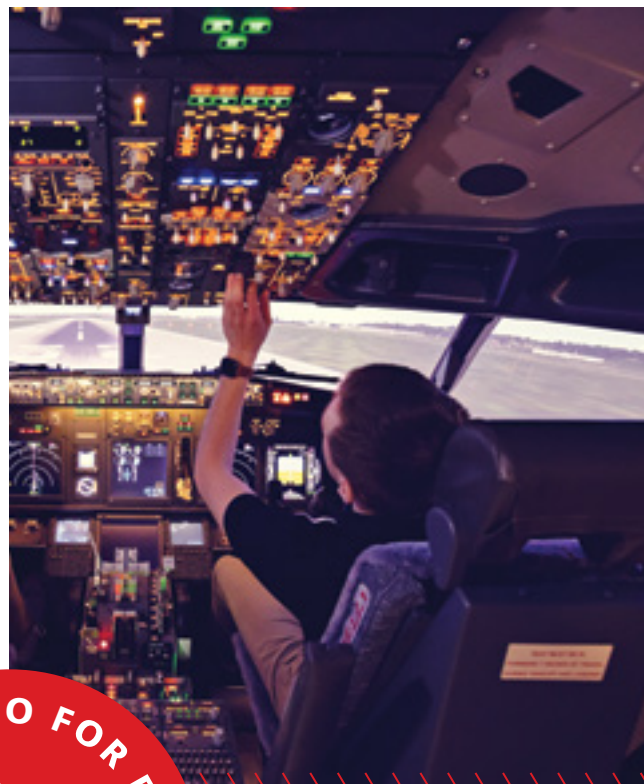

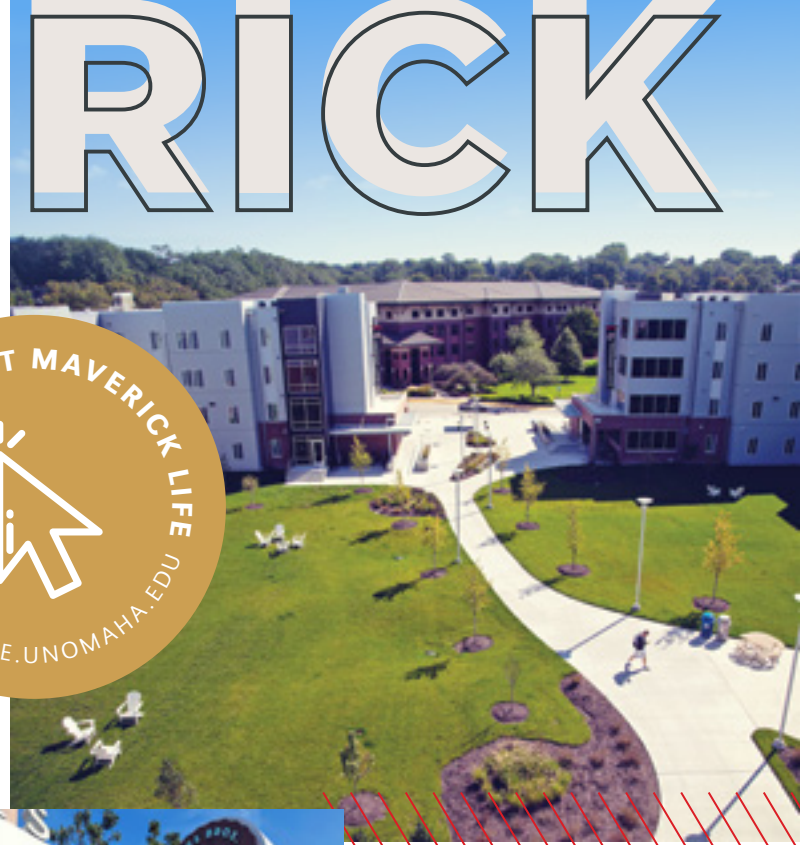

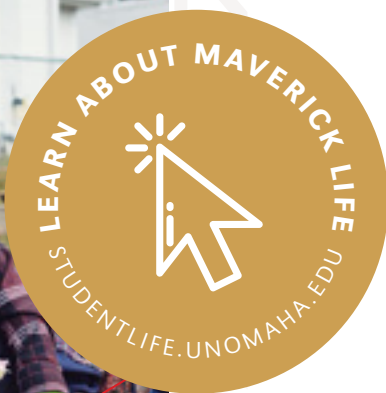

# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Along with your application, you'll be asked to submit test scores and an official high school transcript. No application fee required for domestic students. **Your records must show completion of the 14 minimum course unit requirements (below) and one of the following: ACT composite score of 20+, SAT score of 1040+, Cumulative GPA of 3.0 (4.0 scale), or Class ranking in the upper 50%.**

## COURSE UNIT REQUIREMENTS | (14 total)

<b>ENGLISH</b>	All units must include intensive reading and writing experience.	<b>4 units</b>
<b>MATH</b>	Courses must include Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry	<b>3 units</b>
<b>SOCIAL SCIENCE</b>	At least one (1) American and/or World History; one (1) American Government and/or Geography	<b>3 units</b>
<b>NATURAL SCIENCE</b>	At least two (2) must be selected from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Earth Sciences. One (1) must include a lab course	<b>3 units</b>
<b>ELECTIVE</b>	One additional year from any listed above	<b>1 unit</b>

## TRANSFER STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

- Official coursework completed after high school graduation from a regionally-accredited or non-accredited collegiate institution
- Graduated from a regionally-accredited high school or completed the equivalent academic training (GED)
- Meet the GPA requirement for the program to which you applied

Be in good academic standing at your previous institution(s)
